



Incorporating the Cavity Free at Three model into your Electronic Health Records can streamline the documentation process.

- Cavity Free at Three trains providers on conducting risk assessment and provides you with a Caries Risk Assessment Form (enclosed).
- Colorado Regulations Department of Health Care Policy and Financing requires "...a formal risk assessment shall be performed and documented as part of the patient record". 10 CCR 2505-10 8.202.2.A, pg. 28 "Covered Services"

Tips:

- Make a plan ahead of time on how you will document and incorporate Cavity Free at Three in your EHR (if applicable). Contact IT or EHR services providers well before the Cavity Free at Three training so details can be worked out in anticipation of your go-live date.
- We recommend embedding Caries Risk Assessment (CRA) in an EHR template.
- Some practices use a laminated CRA in each patient room and document with auto-populated phrases for the patient chart, in EPIC called DOT/smart phrases (see sample Progress Note).
- Another option is to fill out the CRA by hand, and scan into the patient record.
- Providers can enter an "order" for the Fluoride Varnish in EHR. This allows you to track the services provided and inventory of supplies. See Supplies Section for further details.

Refer to insurance plans about specific reimbursement requirements for documentation in patient record.
