- Pair with Well Child Visit and submit on electronic claim 837I
- Document formal Caries Risk Assessment in patient chart
- Reimbursable twice per year, two additional per year for high caries risk children

Billing Ages 5-20

D0190 Dental Screening

D1206 Topical Fluoride Varnish

- **Z13.84** Screening for dental disorders (EPSDT ICD 10–Diagnosis codes)
- Reimbursable a maximum three times, regardless of risk
- Not required to pair with well child visit; submit on electronic claim 8371

High Caries Risk

 Documentation of risk using a <u>Pediatric Oral Health Screening form</u> must be part of the child member's medical and/or dental record

- Qualified Medical Personnel include Physicians (MDs), Osteopaths (DOs), Nurse Practitioners (NPs) and Physicians Assistants (PAs) with a focus on primary care, general practice, internal medicine or pediatrics and who have completed training.
- Qualified Medical Personnel who complete training must provide **documentation of training** when requested.

¹ For <u>Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs)</u> and <u>Rural Health Centers</u> with encounter based reimbursement, no additional fee for oral health services provided by **medical personnel** at the well child visit may be submitted. Dental HCPCS should be included on the 837I electronic claim form with the <u>well child visit HCPC and ICD 10 code</u>. Use appropriate revenue code.
